LOTTE INCH GALLERY is a new temporary art gallery project within the centre of York: a city which is creatively rich, but potentially even more so... The gallery will showcase celebrated artists from London and the rest of the UK as well as a select collection of design led products from independent and emerging designers.

The Gallery promises to be York's most individual art gallery space dedicated to supporting the work of local and national, distinguished and emerging artists. With a commitment to offering original, inspirational and affordable art to everyone. Expelling

the pretence of many commercial art galleries LOTTE INCH GALLERY will be the most welcoming place you are likely to set foot in in York.

Set up by experienced curator, Lotte Inch, the gallery will run as a temporary space until the New Year and will host a series of 3 separate exhibitions showcasing exciting names from the British Art World. The first show will feature work by 'Young British Artist' **Gavin Turk**, along with a portfolio of prints produced for **The House of Fairy Tales**,* London which includes prints from artists Peter Blake, Rachel Whiteread, Bob & Roberta Smith, Paula Rego and Simon English, amongst others. Alongside the show, design-led products and gifts made and designed in the UK will be available from the likes of Tatty Devine, York's own Red Brick North, Ali Miller, The Rosie Lee Tea Company and Gillian Kyle.

A subsequent exhibition will feature more work by celebrated artists from London and Brighton including Tessa Farmer and John Dilnot and will open on to the public on Saturday 20th October until Thursday 22nd November. TITLE TBC.

The third exhibition FROST will run from Saturday 24th November to Saturday 29th December and will present work from Anthony Frost and his father Sir Terry Frost. Additional works from Rob Ryan and other artists will also be available for sale.

***The House of Fairy Tales** was established by artists Deborah Curtis and Gavin Turk, and is a child-centred, artist-led project which draws on an extensive team of artists, performers, writers, educationalists, designers, musicians, film makers, dreamers and philosophers to create magical, parallel worlds where learning is play and play is directed learning. Operating across a number of formats from workshops, publishing, advocacy and education packs, The House of Fairy Tales is about making education inclusive, inventive and fun.
